Commission Chairman Fred Hamic called the meeting to order and welcome guests and media present. Commissioner Spivey opened the meeting with prayer. Chairman Hamic led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. Jail Construction: County Attorney stated that he had wrote a letter as requested to Architect, Mike Rutland, concerning the amendment for their fees but has not received a response back. Attorney Eldridge stated that if he had not heard from Mr. Rutland today that he would call and let him know that commission would like for him to be at the December 10 meeting to discuss the matter.

The issue was discussed with the commission agreeing. Commissioner Hammer made the motion to allow additional four hours holiday pay be paid to employees to cover Wednesday closing at noon. Commissioner Brannon seconded the motion. Vote was 4-0.

The rain issues are preventing bush hogging.

ADEM met with Engineer at the landfill for approval to apply for the new five-year contract and they did not see any issues.

Engineer and secretary will be attending class for the new FEMA portal for imputing the hurricane debris approved for reimbursement of removal.

Engineer has made a list of requirements that will be issued to the citizens for the county to be able to pick up the hurricane debris. The citizens would have up to January 31, 2019 to place their debris to the right of way. Commissioner Brannon made a motion to accept the debris requirements for citizens as new policy to be used for this issue and forward. Commissioner Hammer seconded the motion. Vote was 4-0.





Commissioner Hammer made the motion to adjourn. Commissioner Spivey seconded the motion. Vote was 4-0.





Memorandum

Hurricane Michael Organic Debris Pickup Policy
(limbs, tree trunks, etc)

- Limbs and tree trunks shall not be over 10 ft in length
- Limbs and tree trunk cut ends shall be placed in the same direction
- Debris shall be placed a minimum of 8 ft from the edge of pavement on County paved roads and as far away as possible on County unpaved roads. Under no circumstances shall debris be placed in the roadway.
- Under no circumstance shall household trash, solid waste, etc. be placed in the organic debris. The material will not be picked up by Road and Bridge and will be subject to material being pushed back onto private property.
- All organic debris shall be placed for the County to pick-up by January 31, 2019. After this time frame it will be against County policy to pick up private generated organic debris.
- Geneva County Road and Bridge Department reserves the right to not pick up debris under certain situations.
